Keeping It Real at Easter

The Easter stories are wonderful, mysterious glimpses into an event so overwhelming that it changed the world. It wasn't long before the apostles and their followers, utterly convinced that the risen Lord had destroyed death and opened the way of eternal life, had gone to practically the whole known world with the story of Jesus.

Yet there are and were those who would not accept this wonderful and mysterious message. To some, the resurrection of Jesus is a fairy tale and a delusion. For some, being "spiritual" is a generic category that addresses certain feelings of awe and wonder but does not attach to any particular event or narrative. "I am spiritual but not religious" is a common modern refrain. There are more and more folks checking "none" when a survey asks for affiliation with a faith community — any faith community, Christian or otherwise.

So how do we believers keep the Easter message real? Can we say with Mary Magdalene, the disciples, and St. Paul, "I have seen the Lord"? Is the way of Jesus disappearing among the competing claims on our attention, and in the face of an increasingly secular, hostile, and violent world?

Here are some questions to ponder:

Can we participate in worship expecting to meet the risen Lord? If Jesus is risen, he is with us. You may find him in the bread and wine of his Supper, in a hymn, in the words of Scripture or a sermon, or in a kind word said by a brother or sister. Where genuine love is, Christ is present.

Can we pray with the firm conviction that God hears us? "Ask and you shall receive", says Jesus. Our conviction is that the risen Lord is listening and will answer — perhaps not always as we want, but always as he promises to be with us.

Can we face every day knowing that we can trust ourselves completely to the care of God? As the United Church of Canada's confession of faith affirms: "In life, in death, in life beyond death, God is with us. We are not alone."

Whatever befalls us, nothing can separate us from him and from his Son. That's the real Easter; that's the eternal promise.

APRIL 4, 2023 SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Salem's Congregation Council met on Tuesday, April 4, 2023, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. Council members Jacqueline Beverage, Alan Deaton, Patricia Farley, Walter Farley, Donna Fraley, Bonnie Guyer, Durk Hellinga, Dean Lundeen, Pastor Steve Mindrup, and Nancy Rex attended this meeting.

Following devotions provided by Alan Deaton, minutes of the March 7, 2023, Congregation Council meeting as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for February 2023. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported that all bills are currently paid and reported balances in the following accounts as of April 4, 2023.

General Fund: \$9518.00 Designated Fund: \$29,055.79 Capital Fund: \$51,267.85

Treasurer Bonnie Guyer also reported that to date the Renovation Fund has \$19,090.00, Lenten Offerings designated for Salem's budgeted benevolence commitment are \$4128.00, soup supper offerings designated for the Northern Illinois Food Bank are \$723.00, and offerings collected at the Community Lenten Breakfast and Worship designated for Our Sharing Pantry are \$223.00. The treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Monthly reports were presented by Pastor Mindrup and representatives of Salem's committees.

Fifteen Salem members and friends volunteered at Northern Illinois Food Bank warehouse in Geneva on March 21. This day marked the end of eight years of monthly shifts. On this day they packed 3,108 pounds of food, equating to 2,590 meals for hungry neighbors in 16 Illinois counties. Their task was sorting, labeling and packing canned vegetables that had been donated by major corporations. Since our first shift on April 9, 2015, we have provided volunteer help monthly except for a few months during the height of the Covid 19 pandemic. Our next volunteer shift is set for Tuesday, April 18, 9:00-11:30 am. At that time we will be presenting our Lenten Soup Supper Offerings of \$723.
