The duty of self examination

This article first appeared in our newsletter about a year ago. A few folks told me that they found it helpful. I think it bears repeating.

Self-examination ought to be a part of every serious disciple's spiritual life. A vigorous inventory of one's behavior is necessary for those who would maintain a right relationship to God.

Our traditional liturgy most always includes a prayer of confession and a time for examination of conscience. Despite our accomplishments and victories, at our core we know that we remain forgiven sinners. Saved by grace alone.

Here is a model for examination of conscience from the 18th century English reformer John Wesley. It points the way to a more rigorous and passionate style of Christian witness.

What would happen if you made these 22 questions a regular part of your devotional life? Could such a practice become an invitation to let God's grace move you to a greater consciousness of his presence in your life and a more serious commitment to Jesus' way of holy living? Ponder and see:

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give it time to speak to me every day?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?

AUGUST 1, 2023 SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Salem's Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, August 1, 2023, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. Nine council members attended this meeting. Pastor Steve Mindrup was on vacation. Following devotions provided by Walter Farley, minutes of the July 5, 2023, Salem Congregation Council meeting as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for June 2023. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported that all bills are paid to date and reported balances as of August 1, 2023, for the following accounts.

General Fund: \$9205.34 Designated Fund: \$28,433.39 Capital Fund: \$49,833.72

The treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Council representatives to Salem's committees reported. The Christian Education Committee report noted work on plans for the upcoming fall season. The Finance Committee report noted that a mortgage payment in addition to the regular monthly mortgage payment was made. The Mission Committee report noted work on continuing projects such as quilts, Northern Illinois Food Bank, etc. The Property Committee report noted that the blacktop project is complete and the bill has been paid. The Worship Committee report noted that there will be an opportunity for Picnic And Worship Service (PAWS) on Wednesday, August 16, 2023, starting at 6:30 p.m.

PLEASE HELP OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL

collect items for Lutheran World Relief School kits.

Our collection will run through mid-September. Your donations may be placed in the box in the narthex or the box in the vestibule at the office entrance.

While there are groups and organizations that provide similar kits for local children in need, this project focuses on global needs. These kits are meant for children who have been forced to leave their homes in Ukraine and in Syria and children who live in poverty areas in Africa and South America.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT

ONE 2 1/2" eraser	ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons	FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band	FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band	ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)	ONE pencil sharpener	ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other	FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; no loose leaf paper

The needs are quite specific. Please note the instruction below.

- Please give new items only
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.

If you are able, please try to donate the items for a complete kit rather than multiples of one or two items only. This will help us to ensure an even collection of the needed items. THANK YOU!
