Dear Friends in Faith,

"We ask your blessing, O Lord, upon us, and upon these your gifts. Amen" "Let us give thanks to the Lord for he is good, and his mercy endures

forever. Amen"

These were the prayers we prayed in my family every lunch and supper when we sat down to eat together. We said the first prayer before we began the meal, and the second prayer as we finished, before anyone was allowed to leave. These were simple prayers, which only took a moment, yet they set the tone for our time together. Each meal was a sacred time, and our food was a gift from God. We never forgot to eat, so we could be sure that we would always remember to pray, to spend at least those few moments each day in thanks to our God.

The Christian life is shaped by sacred moments such as these. It is in these times set aside for God that we define who we are and what we are here for. Each Christian has different ways to make their faith relationship real and present in their life. There is no single pattern that everyone has to follow, but every Christian has ways that they remind themselves of their relationship to God, and times that they renew those ties.

One event that is essential for people of faith is worship with the people of God. This is the single most important time of the week when God forms us as a potter forms the clay. None of us can be Christians on our own, and none of us will live by God's will unless we take these times to intentionally shape our lives. Worship is a defining moment, as the people of God come together to remember once again who we are, and what we are here for.

We remember the bad old days of the pandemic, when we had to break that pattern of gathering together. It simply was not safe to sit side by side and sing our hearts out in church. Thankfully the vaccines came, and we do feel safe to gather and sit side by side again. People can also have busy times when they fall away from worship, and summer travels that make us break patterns.

When we do something several times in a row, it becomes a habit, for good or bad. Coming to church is a good habit, like the habit of saying those mealtime prayers. It sets the tone for the week, and draws us together in community with God's people. It focuses our hearts on God's call for our lives and helps us see the needs of our neighbor.

For any number of reasons, many people have broken that good habit of worship. They got used to doing other things, and used to not being with others for worship. It does take a real effort to set aside the worship time, to get yourself ready, and to walk through those doors once again. If you haven't been coming for a while, you have to break one habit to start a new one. You need to do it this week, and the next week, until it feels normal again.

July 1, 2025 Salem Congregation Council Meeting Highlights

The Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, July 1, 2025, starting at 6:27 p.m. Council members Jacqueline Beverage, Ron Cunz, Alan Deaton, Walter Farley, Donna Fraley, Bonnie Guyer, Connie Hanson, Durk Hellinga, Sharon Wallis and Pastor John Rothfusz were present.

Ron Cunz led the devotion about our Good Shepherd, Jesus, who searches and finds lost sheep. God's love pursues us and brings us back.

The council voted to accept the minutes of the June 3 Congregation Council meeting, as prepared by Alan Deaton.

The Financial reports for May were examined. These are the following balances as of the meeting.

General Fund:	\$9,372.48	Loan Balance \$403,122.32
Designated Fund:	\$39,236.96	
Capital Fund:	\$33,872.53	

Council members heard monthly reports from Pastor John Rothfusz and from council members representing Salem's committees. They reviewed the calendar to highlight events coming up in August and look for conflicts.

The Christian Education Committee is planning a Baked Goods Raffle for Rally Sunday once again.

The Outreach Committee will assemble the float and join in the Freedom Days parade.

The Property Committee reported that the boiler was repaired and the downspouts were rerouted.

The Worship team reported that we are considering a Thursday Music night, with Praise Team at 5, Chimes at 6, and Salem Choir at 7.

The Endowment/Memorial Committee reported receiving several new memorials, including one for \$2500 for Sharon Foster.

The group heard council comments from each member.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:01 p.m.



Thursday Music Night?

In Salem's several music groups, we have been having a conversation about whether we should move to a single music night on Thursday. We could keep meeting at the same times, with the Praise team at 5, the Chimes at 6, and the Salem Choir at 7. This might help several people who currently travel both Monday and Thursday. We can also hope that people might choose to share in more groups if they are there anyway, strengthening all of them.

Most responses to this idea have been positive. We haven't made any final decision yet, but we would probably start this pattern in the fall. A few committees might need to shift times as well, if members are busy on Thursday. Please let Pastor John or the worship team know if you have thoughts on this.

Synod Assembly Highlights

Pastor John Rothfusz, Sharon Wallis, Durk Hellinga and Marilyn Wouda attended the Synod Assembly on June 13-14 at Augustana College, Rock Island. They represented Salem Lutheran church and served as voting members.

Durk Hellinga was elected to the Synod Outreach Committee.

Several resolutions were considered and passed by the assembly. These were: R-1: Resolution for National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding Schools; R-2: Northern Illinois Synod to Be a Reconciling in Christ Synod.

In the coming weeks we will have a short forum with the voting members to discuss the Synod Assembly and the actions taken. You are welcome to come to learn and discuss the event with us.
