Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year about this time as young people graduate from high school and college, I am struck by how quickly time passes. While I can picture them as babies and small children, they are now striding forth as adults into the world. It is a miracle before our eyes to see them grow into interesting, smart, hardworking people who will make a difference in the world.

Yet even in that moment of celebration, there is often great uncertainty. What is next? Even if they are going to college, or have a job, it is a time of great change, a time to reassess their identity and place in the world. Who will they be, and what will it lead them to do?

I read a blog with some great questions about how we fit in the world. It is addressed to graduates first, but I think that these questions remain vital for each of us as long as we live. As people of faith, God has called us each by name in our baptism and sent us out into the world to love and serve. What does that mean for you?

The questions are: Who are you called to be?

What are you called to do?

Why are you here?

We may struggle to answer those in a big-picture way even when we are much older. But what if we answer these questions for the immediate present? What if we answer them just for the moment, fully expecting our answers to evolve and change over time? What if we explore these questions as a part of our journey with Jesus, as a part of following our Lord on the path that he leads us, as graduates or people of any age?

With such a present-tense focus, our life can become an act of living into God's call for us. Most of us don't hear God's call in a vision or a burning bush, but in real, physical needs placed right before us. A child whose hand you can hold when they are uncertain, a garden you can plant and tend lovingly, a neighbor you can feed by keeping the Blessing Box or Our Sharing Pantry stocked. Or in learning patience and gentleness for ourselves and others. Patience with a driver who is slow to move at the stoplight. Quietness and listening in a group, to make sure that each person gets a time to have their voice heard. Grace for someone who doesn't meet our expectations, realizing that their lives may be more complicated and difficult than we know.

June 6, 2025 Salem Congregational Council Meeting Highlights

The Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, June 6, 2025, starting at 6:30 p.m. Council members Ron Cunz, Alan Deaton, Walter Farley, Donna Fraley, Bonnie Guyer, Connie Hanson, Durk Hellinga, Sharon Wallis and Pastor John Rothfusz were present. Jacqueline Beverage was absent.

Alan Deaton led the devotion about seeds planted in the ground, and the thrill of watching them grow if conditions are right. God's kingdom grows and bears fruit in the same way among us.

The council voted to accept the minutes of the May 6 Congregation Council meeting, as prepared by Alan Deaton.

The Financial reports for March were examined. These are the following balances as of the meeting.

General Fund:	\$7658.56
Designated Fund:	\$33,828.36
Capital Fund:	\$35,593.85

Council members heard monthly reports from Pastor John Rothfusz and from council members representing Salem's committees. They reviewed the calendar to highlight events coming up in June and look for conflicts.

The Christian Education Committee noted that 3N1 has purchased a ping pong table for the basement from the Bobby Harpster memorials. 3N1 will also need to find new leadership as the Boczkos step down.

The Fellowship Committee hosted a Fellowship Feast at Salem on May 27 for the community. It went very well, and served about 70 people.

The Outreach Committee is offering a new Salem Lutheran t-shirt to show our pride in the community. Order forms are available in the coffee area.

The property committee is working to mark items for disposal from closets and storerooms. Decluttered items will be placed in the basement outside the elevator for a time for leaders to evaluate.

The group heard council comments from each member.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### Northern Illinois Synod Assembly

The Synod Assembly will be held June 13-14 at Augustana College. Durk and Marilyn Hellinga and Sharon Wallis will be our voting members, along with Pastor John.

The Synod Assembly offering will go to support Global Refuge, formerly called Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service. This is a group we as Lutherans can be proud of that originated after World War II to help displaced people.

The 2025 Synod Assembly In-Kind offering will be advocacy letters. Congregations are encouraged to have members write letters to their representative and senators.
