From Pastor Steve . . .



We don't pay a whole lot of attention to the Day of Pentecost. The celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit — the completion of the promise of the risen Lord — is overshadowed by the beginning of summer vacations and Memorial Day weekend (which is exactly how Pentecost falls this year).

In ancient times the day of Pentecost was second only to Easter in importance, and was celebrated with great solemnity. There is evidence from as early as the fourth century AD that Pentecost was already an established feast day.

The word "Pentecost" means *fiftieth* in Greek. For the people of Israel it was a harvest festival which took place fifty days after Passover — called the "Feast of Weeks" in the Old Testament. It was a pilgrim festival, meaning that it was properly celebrated in the Jerusalem Temple. The book of Acts tells us that "devout Jews from every nation" were in Jerusalem for the Feast of Weeks (Acts 2:5). For us, Pentecost is the fiftieth day after Easter, the culmination of our focus on the risen Christ.

The Christian significance of Pentecost is the gift of the Holy Spirit to the apostles. Jesus had told his followers to remain in Jerusalem and to expect to receive God's power. The Spirit descends on the apostles under the sign of fire and of wind ("wind" and "spirit" in Hebrew are the same word). The manifestation of the Spirit's power is shown by the apostles' ability to testify to the death and resurrection of Jesus in a way that the assembled Jews from many nations could understand.

Let us celebrate the Holy Spirit this May 28 by asking God to continue to empower his church to witness to his Son. Let us celebrate the Holy Spirit by realizing that the Spirit does indeed give us power to do the works of love and devotion to which we are called. Let us learn from our ancestors in the faith how to speak and act boldly for the sake of God's kingdom.

MAY 2, 2023 SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Salem's Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, May 2, 2023, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. Council members Alan Deaton, Patricia Farley, Walter Farley, Donna Fraley, Bonnie Guyer, Pastor Steve Mindrup, and Nancy Rex attended this meeting. Three council members were absent.

Following devotions provided by Donna Fraley, minutes of the April 4, 2023, Salem Congregation Council meeting as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for March 2023. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported that all current bills are paid and reported balances in the following accounts as of May 2, 2023. General Fund: \$14,493.47; Designated Fund: \$28, 633.62; Capital Fund: \$52,869.65

Treasurer Bonnie Guyer also reported that \$25,002.84 of the Capital Fund is specified for renovation. The Treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Pastor Mindrup reported that Holy Week and Easter Sunday worship services were well attended and worshipful. Pastor Mindrup recommended EmmaLee Renee Houser for the Rite of Confirmation. Salem's Congregation Council approved this recommendation.

Representatives of Salem's committees presented reports. Property Committee reported that a bid of \$11,800.00 by George and Sons for the blacktop project was accepted, and that Gary Augustine will work on the outside painting project.

Pastor Mindrup noted that area ministers were considering the return of Fellowship Feasts possibly starting in October 2023. He volunteered Salem to host the first feast. Council members agreed that Salem will host.


