From Pastor Steve



I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart. Psalm 9:1

A long time ago, a good friend, now deceased, realized that her drinking had become a problem. She reached out for help and began to attend AA meetings.

Her sponsor suggested that, every night before bedtime she should write out a "gratitude list" – at least ten things for which she was thankful. She was told that giving thanks was a way to take her focus off of quitting drinking and to center on the presence of God.

The first time she tried to do it, she spent almost two hours staring at a blank sheet of paper. So depressed and angry over her alcoholism, so unhappy with the state her life was in, she could find nothing for which she was grateful.

What's on your gratitude list this Thanksgiving? I hope that it goes beyond wealth, status, possessions – the creature comforts we usually call "blessings' – and moves toward gratitude that you are a forgiven sinner and have been given a place in God's eternal kingdom. I hope that you are grateful for opportunities to serve others and to allow the love of Christ to become real in your life. If resentment and anger are poisoning your thankfulness, I hope that you know that God is present with you and is ready to be gracious and make a way for you.

As we prepare to conclude this year's stewardship campaign, I hope that our gratitude to God for all that we have and all that we are will translate into generous support for the work of Salem and the work of the church throughout the world. Your annual gifts reach into hundreds of places both locally and globally. What better way to give thanks?

And what of my friend? As she recovered her sobriety and her sense of God's work in her life, her gratitude list began to grow. Almost to the end of her days she wrote out that list every night. It had expanded to well over ten things, and took only minutes.

In that spirit, and with thanks to God for all that God has given, I wish you all a happy and peaceful Thanksgiving.

NOVEMBER 7, 2023, SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Salem's Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. Nine of ten council members attended this meeting. Council members elect Ron Cunz and Connie Hanson also attended this meeting.

Following devotions provided by Nancy Rex, the minutes of the October 3, 2023, Salem Congregation Council meeting and the October 22, 2023, meeting of Salem Congregation as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for September 2023. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported balances as of November 7, 2023, for the following accounts.

General Fund: \$8477.20

Designated Fund: \$28,990.56

Capital Fund: \$33,433.32

Treasurer Bonnie Guyer noted that although no additional transfer of funds was necessary to pay current bills, the transfer of \$7000.00 from the Capital Fund to the General Fund made last month has not been repaid. The treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Regular monthly reports were made by Pastor Mindrup and committee representatives. More details about committee work are available in the Salem Life, weekly news, or by talking with any congregation council member.

Thanksgiving envelope offerings were designated to the Middle East crisis and Christmas Envelope offerings and loose offering on Christmas Eve were designated to Salem's General Fund.

Installation of 2024 Salem Congregation Council members was set for Sunday, December 31, 2023, during the 9:00 a.m. worship service.

NEW COUNCIL MEMBERS ELECTED OCTOBER 22

At the congregational meeting held on Sunday, October 22, Ron Cunz, Alan Deaton and Connie Hanson were elected to serve three year terms on Salem's Congregation Council beginning in January, 2024. Ron and Connie were newly elected, and Alan was re-elected to serve a second three-year term. We thank them for their willingness to serve in this very important way. Thanks also to those voting members who stayed after the worship service to ensure that a quorum was present to conduct the business of the congregation.
