OCTOBER 3, 2023, SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Salem's Congregation Council met at Salem on Tuesday, October 3, 2023, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. All ten council members attended this meeting.

Following devotions provided by Jacqueline Beverage, the minutes of the September 5, 2023, Salem Congregation Council meeting as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for August 2023. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported the balances as of October 3, 2023, for the following accounts.

General Fund: \$10,532.22; Designated Fund: \$28,837.29; Capital Fund: \$31,038.89

Treasurer Bonnie Guyer noted that for the first time in many months, a transfer from the Capital Fund to the General Fund was made to pay current bills. That transfer of \$7000.00 is included in the \$10,532.22 reported in the General Fund. The treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Regular monthly reports were made by Pastor Mindrup and committee representatives. Committee representatives were reminded to prepare budget requests for 2024. More details about committee work are available in the Salem Life, weekly news, or by talking with any council member.

With a meeting of Salem Congregation scheduled for Sunday, October 22, 2023, following the 9:00 a.m. worship service to elect members of Salem's Congregation Council, Nominating Committee members Jan Dunn, Sandra Martens, and Marilyn Wouda will be reminded to seek people willing to be elected to Salem's Congregation Council.

Alan Deaton reported a successful Crop Walk including \$3134.00 and 15 walkers from Salem. An executive session followed to discuss personnel, salary, wages, and employment.


