

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Be Awkward, So They Don't Have to Be."

As a motto for hospitality, that is a pretty good one. I heard that phrase on a presentation for youth group leaders, and how we can guide them. Young

people often are most comfortable gathering into cliques, with insiders and outsiders. They direct all of their attention and care within the group, and can be dismissive or hostile to those outside.

But if youth leaders want to make a difference for Jesus, they need to have eyes for more than just the clique of friends where they are comfortable. They need to see the ones on the outside, and engage with them. They need to broaden their circle of friends to include all those who want to be a part and learn more about Jesus. If they can "Be Awkward" to love and care for the outsiders as well as the insiders, the group will be transformed into something much more like what Jesus calls us to be.

The presenter even has her youth leaders call the kids who are missing from the group. They may be busy, or sick, or out of town, but they may also just not feel needed or welcomed. It makes an enormous difference in the lives of those kids to know that one of their peers knows them, cares about them, and reaches out to see how they are doing.

This is great advice for kids. But the thing is, it is also great advice for adults as well. We are not a highly organized youth group, with a clear covenant of expectations. But we are a part of the church of Jesus, and the same things apply to us.

What if we were to "Be Awkward" in care for each one as well? What if we come to church with our eyes open for someone new, or someone we don't talk to often, instead of just going to the comfortable circle of those we always talk to? Can we be hospitable hosts in the Lord's house, just as we would be in our own?

What if we make it abundantly clear that we are glad to see each person, and even call to check in with them if they miss? One of the big changes in church in recent years is not people dropping out, but "regular" attenders coming less often. We find many more things these days that pull us away from church and the worshipping community. We may travel, visit family, or go to an event, or just not feel like it that Sunday morning. And once we break the habit of regular worship, we find it easier to drift away more and more often.

So what would happen if we would "Be Awkward" and reach out to those who have not been here, and just check in and say that we missed them? Yes it might feel awkward, but they will also get the real feeling that we care about them and miss them. People often come to worship to be a part of the community of people who know and care for them as we share in Jesus together. And they drift away if they don't feel like they are connected or cared for in a way that matters to them.

Main Street Reconstruction in 2025



Salem Lutheran received notice that Main Street will be reconstructed next year, including in front of the church. This is the same kind of thing that we experienced this year on Latham Street with significant shifting of traffic, and unplanned disruptions. There is not much that we can do to prepare for that project, except to be ready. We look forward to a beautiful new road in front of the church when the work is done!

Road Sign Team Update

The Road Sign Team has slowed its work for a time. We don't see much value in pushing to complete a sign along Main Street while travel there is disrupted. The team also wants to work to find agreement on a design before we rush ahead with plans, so we will probably not build a new sign along Main Street until the reconstruction is complete.

We may move quickly on a sign on the northeast wall by the parking lot. The goal here is much simpler - to have the name of the church clear for those who approach on Pleasant Ave. or park in the lot, so that people can be sure that they have come to the right place. This sign should be much simpler and less expensive.

OCTOBER 3, 2024, SALEM CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Salem's Congregation Council met at Salem on Thursday, October 3, 2024, starting at approximately 6:30 p.m. Jacqueline Beverage, Ron Cunz, Alan Deaton, Walter Farley, Donna Fraley, Bonnie Guyer, Durk Hellinga, Nancy Rex, and Pastor John Rothfusz attended this meeting. Connie Hanson was absent.

Following devotions led by Durk Hellinga, the minutes of the September 3, 2024, Congregation Council meeting as prepared by Secretary Jacqueline Beverage were accepted.

Council members studied the financial reports for August 2024. Treasurer Bonnie Guyer reported balances in the following accounts as of October 3, 2024.

General Fund: \$11,526.81 Designated Fund: \$30,760.83 Capital Fund: \$35,236.45

All bills are currently paid. The treasurer's report as presented by Treasurer Bonnie Guyer was accepted.

Pastor John Rothfusz presented his September 2024 report of activities including information about the Professional Leadership Conference he attended September 30 - October 2, 2024.

Council representatives serving on Salem Committees reported on work being done by the various committees.

Council members voted to nominate Dean Lundeen to be elected to the Memorial and Endowment Fund Board at the January 2025 Annual Meeting of Salem Congregation.

Council members spent some time reviewing plans for the meeting of Salem Congregation scheduled for Sunday, October 13, 2024, starting immediately following the worship service at approximately 10:00 a.m.

There was some discussion about Salem's policy on raffles and other fund raisers.

The motion was carried for Pastor Rothfusz to stay on the Portico Gold Plus Plan.

Pastor Rothfusz initiated some discussion about locking the building and keys to Salem.



On Sunday, October 6, **Brynnlee Bee Diggle** and **Grace Lee Diggle** were received as children of God and members of this congregation through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Brynnlee and Grace are the daughters of Haley Claxton and Daniel Diggle, sisters to Raelynn. Todd Claxton is their grandfather. We rejoice with Brynnlee and Grace and their family.



Congregational Meeting is Sunday, October 13

The council has set the October Congregational Meeting for October 13 after worship. We will hold elections for council members and consider amendments to our Salem Constitution. Please put that date on your calendar, and be sure to share with your Salem Family as we work together.

1. Amendment for Endowment and Memorial Board terms

Current text: C5.05.01

....Members shall not be eligible for consecutive terms and may serve no more than 2 non-consecutive terms....

The proposed text C5.05.01

....Members shall be eligible for two consecutive terms....

Rationale: The Endowment and Memorial Board is concerned qualified and interested members would not be eligible to serve in this role. This would remove the restriction on serving more than one term at a time, or two terms ever. Instead, people could serve two terms in a row, and serve again at a later time, as we permit with the church council.

2. Call Committee Proposed Change

Current text: C13.05. When a pastoral vacancy occurs, a *Call Committee* of six voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Term of office will terminate upon installation of the newly called pastor. By seeking God's will for the congregation through prayer, interviews, consulting of references, and conversation with one another, this committee is to *unanimously* recommend a candidate to the Congregation Council for their consideration.

Proposed text: C13.05this committee is to *find a consensus* to recommend a candidate to the Congregation Council for their consideration.

Rationale: The Call Committee has had difficulty reaching a unanimous vote. A consensus that everyone can accept should be sufficient.

3. Congregation Meeting Quorum proposed change

Current text: C10.04. 40 voting members shall constitute a quorum.

Proposed text: C10.04. 10 percent of the voting members shall constitute a quorum.

Rationale: The model constitution recommends setting a percentage instead of a fixed number for a quorum. Salem Lutheran has sometimes had difficulty reaching a quorum for a meeting, and it is safer to have it pegged to the actual membership and not as fixed number. The risk is that some churches have been unable to reach a quorum to do essential business. Salem's current confirmed (voting) membership is 398, so a current quorum would still be 40.


